As we wrap up the school year, we want to say a huge thank you to every member of the School Council for everything you've achieved this year.



Specialist Support Units: Elm

In Elm class, we have been reading new stories, including Tip Tap went the Crab and Shark in the Park.

The children worked together to make a picture of a rock pool and the deep blue ocean. In PE, they were crabs, walking sidewards, dozing sealions and noisy birds. We counted the various sea creatures and wrote about them in our English books.

For Shark in the Park we made telescopes which we used in our garden to find images from the story. We talked about what we liked to do at the park and wrote sentences about it.

We have been very good at joining in with the repeated refrain of these stories and have learnt new songs about crabs and sharks.

In the role play area, we have been considering healthy foods, the children have made sandwiches with salad and serving smoothies. We also tasted some fruits; watermelon, strawberries, raspberries and plums, considering which we liked the most.

Acorn

We've had another exciting and adventurous half-term in Acorns with our fascinating topic: Long, Long Ago. We began by diving into the world of castles. The children explored why castles were built, who might have lived in them, and how they compare to the homes we live in today. From towers and turrets to moats and drawbridges, the class loved imagining life in medieval times! Next, we travelled even further back in time to learn all about dinosaurs. We investigated what makes a dinosaur a dinosaur, discovered when and where they lived, and learned about the different things they liked to eat. The children were full of curiosity and wonder as we uncovered the secrets of these incredible prehistoric creatures.

In maths this half-term, we've been busy developing our counting skills beyond 20 and exploring number patterns. The children have worked hard to secure their understanding of number bonds to 10, as well as practising doubles and identifying odd and even numbers. We've also had lots of hands-on fun using different manipulatives to create and extend repeating patterns—from colours and shapes to objects and actions! To support our understanding of prepositional language, we went on an exciting bear hunt, using words like *over*, *under*, *through*, and *around* to describe our journey. It's been a great way to bring maths and language learning together in a fun and memorable way! This half-term in Phonics and Writing, the children have been working really hard on writing in full sentences and using a range of red words (common exception words). Our first Write Stuff book was *How to Catch a Star* by Oliver Jeffers. The children thoroughly enjoyed this magical story and made fantastic attempts at retelling and rewriting it in their own words—showing great imagination and growing confidence in their writing. Next, we read *I Wanna Iguana* and used it as a fun introduction to persuasive writing. Inspired by the story, the children wrote their own persuasive letters—each one hoping to convince someone to let them have a pet dog!

We have had a truly fantastic year in Acorns, and it has been a joy to watch the children begin their school journey—growing from tiny Acorns into mighty Oaks. Throughout the year, they have shown a wonderful attitude towards their learning and have consistently demonstrated our school values of pride, achievement, resilience, and kindness. We are incredibly proud of everything they have accomplished and are excited to see their continued growth as they move on to Year 1. They are more than ready for this next step, and we know they will continue to shine!
